Mobile Hope in Dayton





A few years ago, we were approached by a small group who were seeking to reach out to the mobile home park in Dayton. At that time, we were not in a position to take on a second location but we were willing to walk along-side the team to help in any way we could. We assisted them in forming their own nonprofit organization, setting up their board, and assisting with program models we have found to be effective.

Last summer, while we were on our sabbatical, it was impressed on us that we should approach the Dayton location and see if there were ways we could be more helpful and supportive of the work they were doing. After a series of discussions, it was decided that the thing that would be most helpful for the team, and Cathy Walter the Director, would be to fully combine the organizations. This would allow for consistent support, leverage the strengths of each organization, and add some needed structure to what was being offered. We are happy to announce the formal merging of these two organizations under the umbrella of Mobile Hope that took effect in August of this year! Cathy Walter is now employed by Mobile Hope as the Dayton Site Director! Cathy spends most of her time managing after school and evening programs for the children and families of Dayton Properties. She has also been putting in many hours, along with a host of volunteers, working on the new Hope House building where she will now have to run programs within the park. Another Hope House in Dayton!

In August of 2019 we opened the doors of a new 1410 sq.ft. Hope House in Dayton for a new program, "Gearing Up For School!" After initially moving the home onto our lot at 303 York Avenue, we had to remove it and add 37 footings. After management poured the footings, they pieced the two homes together, hooked up the electric and plumbing and turned the keys over to Mobile Hope! This was followed by extensive remodeling that finally started in the Spring of 2019. With the help of The Hearts in Action Men's group from Church of The Open Door, we removed a hallway, four offices, a breakroom, a shower and a bathtub. The piles of debris they would leave each month was a testament of the work accomplished. The rebuild has been over-the-top! New moldings, flooring, windows, toilets and ceilings have created a space for families to gather for our flagship Homework Help and English Language programs.

So many groups were a part of this renovation and we are grateful for their time and expertise! HVAC: Dakota Supply Group and Heating and Cooling Two. Siding and Labor. Russ & Erica Salmon/Contractor Supply. Electrical: Viking Electric and Walter Electrical Contractors. The ramp and interior supplies such as flooring, sheetrock & lumber were purchased with funds from our Community Development Block Grant from Hennepin County. Hershfield's and Hennepin County Recycling Center supplied the paint. And, finally, the amazing volunteers from our Homework Help program painted and scrubbed and organized all of our supplies so that we could meet our August deadline!
